Dr. Ros received his MD and PhD, from the Autonomous University of Barcelona, Spain in his native city. He completed his Residency and Fellowship at Mount Sinai Medical Center/University of Miami, in Florida. He obtained a Master of Public Health (Health Care Policy and Management) at the Harvard School of Public Health in 1998.

After completing his training Dr. Ros became Chief of Gastrointestinal Radiologic Pathology at the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP); later, continued his association with the AFIP as a Visiting Scientist. He became in 1987 The Founding Director of the Division of Abdominal Imaging at the University of Florida (UF) and Director of Magnetic Resonance Imaging. At UF Dr. Ros was promoted to Professor of Radiology and appointed Associate Chairman.

In 1998, Dr. Ros was appointed Professor of Radiology at Harvard Medical School and Executive Vice-Chair at the Brigham and Women's Hospital. In Boston, he also served as Director and Chief Operating Officer of Partners Radiology (Partners Healthcare integrates the Brigham and Women's Hospital and the Massachusetts General Hospital) and Chief of Radiology at the Dana Farber Cancer Institute.

Dr. Ros became the Theodore J. Castele University Professor and Chairman of the Department of Radiology at Case Western Reserve University and Radiologist-in-Chief of the University Hospitals Health System in 2009, there, he also serves as Professor of Pathology. In addition, he served as President of the Clinical Chairs Council and the Board for University Hospitals Cleveland Medical Center from 2015-2017. Dr. Ros was appointed Founding Director of the UH Diagnostics Institute in 2017, which encompasses the Departments of Genetics, Pathology and Radiology.
